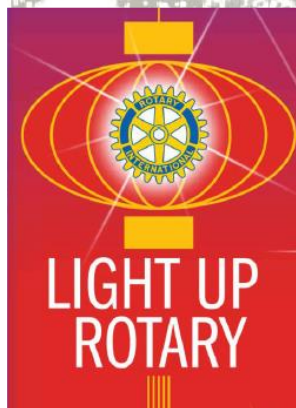

Noel Lindsay

Noel Lindsay spoke to members and guests about a proposed collaboration between the University of Adelaide and schools, TAFE, local and overseas universities, to encourage student entrepreneurship through an e-challenge. One of the streams discussed involved social entrepreneurship, which would assist communities, working with not for profit organisations, such as Rotary, and in particular the Rotary Club of Norwood, but also the Rotary network.

Mentors are being sought to work with students undertaking the programme. Sponsorship is required to support the student programme, and the Government is also being approached. The programme will begin in June of each year. Noel advised he is currently liaising with Euan Miller with regard to this proposal.

Peter Poulton

Introduced our guest speaker, Councillor Crystal Mex from the NPSP Council. Councillor Mex is currently working in the Office for Volunteers, and has just begun her PhD, looking at why people do not volunteer.

Giving an overview of her background, Councillor Mex advised that she was originally from upstate New York, and originally came to Australia, and South Australia, as an exchange student back in the 1980's. In 1985 she married an Australian, and returned to Australia, beginning a position with the Elizabeth Council as a Community Arts Office, and then working for 10 years at the Festival Centre in Adelaide. In 2001 she joined the Office for Volunteers, and working on drafting the Volunteer Protection Act.

Giving details of her PhD, Councillor Mex said that there are currently 5 universities working on the project, looking at 3 areas of interest with regard to volunteering –

Individual – motivation barriers

Organisational – eg Rotary, Meals on Wheels

Society – barriers to volunteering

She advised that 2/3 of the population currently do not volunteer.

11 May is National Volunteers Day, and Councillor Mex presented a Happiness Certificate to President Graham in appreciation of the Rotary Club of Norwood's support of the community.

Councillor Mex took questions from the audience, after which Peter Poulton thanked her for her presentation.

The Australian eChallenge: University of Adelaide's approach to developing entrepreneurial behaviour

Dr Gary Hancock, lecturer and Academic
Director Undergraduate programs, ECIC,

The University of Adelaide will introduce the Australian eChallenge run by the University of Adelaide and discuss its

impacts and influence on entrepreneurial behaviour. The discussion will include an overview of its recent rapid expanded to include high schools, corporate business, regional Australia, and internationally. The Australian eChallenge is the most successful program of its type in Australia and has been recognised internationally for its effectiveness on both its educational and practical impact.

Gary is a lecturer and the director of undergraduate programs, (including the Bachelor of Innovation and Entrepreneurship program) in the Entrepreneurship, Commercialisation and Innovation Centre (ECIC) at The University of Adelaide, and is involved in the e-Challenge competition, Commercialisation Accelerator Program, and ThinkLab, the University's business incubator.

He has previously taught Small Business Management, Entrepreneurship, and New Venture Creation for the University of South Australia and has developed and delivered on-line entrepreneurship courses for the ATN Group of universities.

In addition, Gary has started and harvested a number of small businesses and consulted to a number of companies in the entertainment, telecommunications, transport, and child-care industries.

Gary provides mentor support and advice to young entrepreneurs via the South Australian Young Entrepreneur Scheme (SAYES), is the past President and Chair of the Board of the WEA and has taught business start-up courses for the WEA and Business SA (the South Australian Chamber of Commerce) for many years.
